Haere mai te Wairua Tapu, Come, Holy Spirit. As we feed upon these symbols of Christ's life, broken and poured out for us, grant us a foretaste of resurrection life.

Awaken in us a sense of wonder, gratitude, and hope. Instil in us a yearning for justice, reconciliation, and peace.

A period of silence will be kept. You are invited to ponder the mystery of faith and to hold before God in prayer anything that weighs heavily upon your heart this day. The silence will conclude with the Lord's Prayer (sung).

Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.
